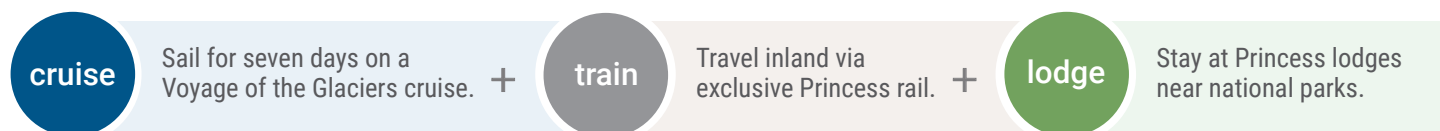

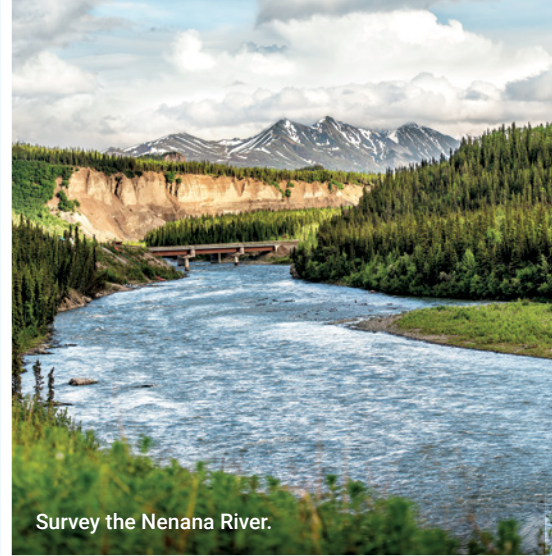

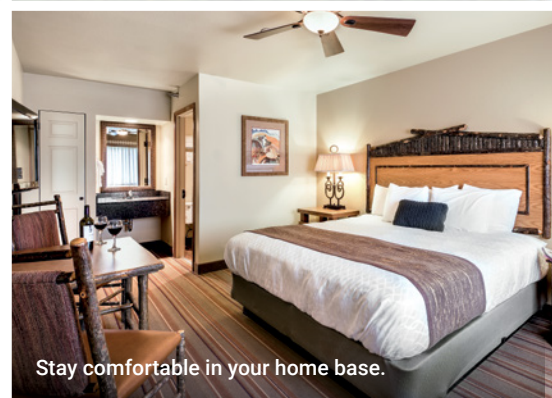

It's located on the south side of Denali National Park; from here you can enjoy the area's walking trails. The heart of the lodge is its Great Room, featuring a freestanding rock fireplace and floor-to-ceiling windows that reveal the dramatic mountain scenery. Relax on our outdoor fireside patio, where guests gather to roast marshmallows and sip warm beverages, and dine at the popular 20,320 Alaskan Grill.

Copper River Princess Wilderness Lodge®

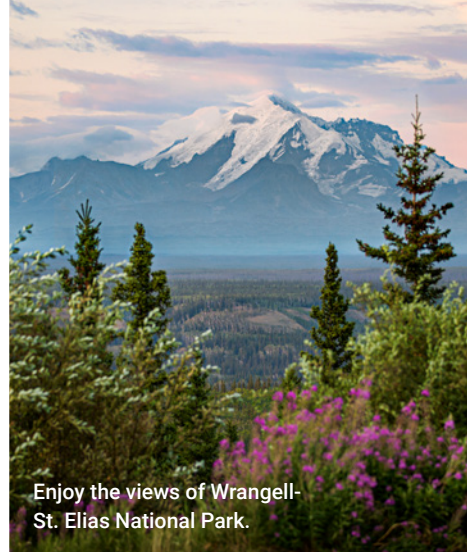

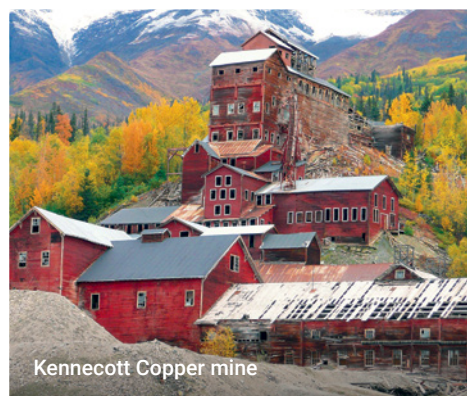
